

Comparison of Spending Power




Settlement Analysis

- In 2014/15, Spending Power per head in predominantly rural areas is about £84 less per head of population.
- This is despite the fact that rural residents pay, on average, £87 per head more in Council Tax than urban residents.
- This is mainly due to the significant disparity in Settlement Funding Assessment which sees urban authorities receive £145 per head more in Government funding.

Settlement Analysis

- The 2014/15 settlement has barely reduced the gap between predominantly rural and urban authorities.
 The gap over 43 per cent has only closed by a half percentage point.
- This is despite the inclusion of ESSSA within SFA.
 However, for predominantly rural authorities, ESSSA is worth 86p per head, a very small proportion of the £134.99 difference in SFA.
