




Rural Housing Policy Review 2015





more sites are needed

new homes must be affordable to local people affordable

leadership is needed from national to community level





Because more sites are needed

- 1. Reverse policy for small sites not to provide affordable quota
- 2. Incentivise land owners to develop rural affordable housing
- 3. Require all Local Plans to be completed within two years.









Because new homes must be affordable to local people

- 4. Exclude rural areas from the "bedroom tax"
- 5. Give rural local authorities the power to suspend the Right to Buy
- 6. A minimum national target for delivery of new rural housing of 13% of HCA programme
- 7. Supporting the development funding of SME builders









Because affordable homes need to be there for future households

- 8. Align rural 'affordable' rents to local incomes rather than 80% of market rent
- 9. Where second home ownership high, allow up to 100% of new homes to be affordable or used as principal residences.
- 10. Standardised mortgage form for rural affordable home ownership











Because leadership is needed from national to community level

- 11. Ensure rural proofing is continuously and consistently applied
- 12.Extend support to communities to produce Neighbourhood Plans.
