



Market Harborough still have traditional bakers, butchers Est. 1800's, Fishmongers with original cold slab Est. 1870 as well as new independent food shops which support using Local Food successfully opening up in the last 24 months.

The town has two original Coach Inns still acting as hotels The Angel and The Three Swans.

The Angel has been very supportive of Community Groups and projects and has recently allowed a large food and drink map to be displayed in one of their display cases.







On the northern edge of the town we are lucky to have the Union Wharf canal basin. A 1900's canal which links to Foxton Locks and Leicester. A fantastic tourist attraction and one aspect of the town which from the State of the Town report findings are seen crucial to local quality of life.



Andrew Granger & Co could cut energy costs at their offices by over £2,000 a year.

How much would you save?

There are plenty of people who claim that they can save you money on your energy bills - whether it's by switching to a better tariff or reducing waste within your building.

At Sustainable Harborough, we were asked to look into specific actions and new equipment that could make a difference at a well-known building within the town – Andrew Granger & Co's offices on the High Street. As a mid-Victorian period building, it is typical of many older shops and offices in the town in that it looks great, but isn't designed for energy efficiency.

Interestingly, the company were already well aware of their heating and lighting costs and had put in some effort to save wasted energy. But despite this, well over £2,000 a year in potential annual savings have now been identified. Although £500 of these savings would require some longer term investment, the rest were either free or could be paid back in a maximum 2 year period.

* Does not include the saving made by staff training or installing power down plugs or 7 day timers as these are harder to calculate as part of annual savings. If these are included, the savings rise to well over £2,000 a year.

This is one of our energy projects which is looking at how to reduce Energy consumption within the town.






There is a mixture of Independent and National Chains within the town with a low amount of vacant premises seen in the town centre.

40.5% of the towns business premises are classed as retail with 58% of businesses within the town surviving for more than 3 years- which is slightly higher than the English average.







One of our 10 partners is the Welland Rivers Trust who have completed a restoration project over the last 2 years on the River Welland which runs through the town. This has included:

- Improving the habitats
- Increasing the biodiversity of habitat and species
- Reduce stagnation and sluggish flow to improve water quality

As a project partner we have worked with them to promote the river restoration as well as plant up complimentary wildflower borders near the river with members of the community.

We also have an active Environment Group in the town which has been established 10 years who organise regular litter picks and also have a boat and do litter picks on the river.

In 1993 the area containing the Peacock Hotel (now Pizza Express), the Indoor Market and the Cattle Market was redeveloped to create St Mary's Shopping Centre and the new market that you see today.





The town has 5 supermarkets within the town, with Sainsbury's and it's car park sitting on the site of the old cattle market.

The original settling rooms are still in the car park (now used as offices).













In 2012/13 The Council decided to invest £480k into the Market.

The money was invested to improve the layout, with a dedicated food hall, public toilets inside the venue, new signage, more inviting entrances and a new flexible trading space which offered a variety of alternative uses.

Since the relaunch in 2014, new trader have been recruited, the trading week extended from 4 days to 6 days with the introduction of a new Wednesday Retro, Vintage and Collectables Market and a Craft Market each Thursday.

A farmers Market is still held on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month on The Square where the Market was traditionally held until 1938 when the Market moved to where Sainsbury's is now located.
