- Localism Act should come into force sometime 2012
- Detailed guidelines follow...2012/13!

Longcut to Big Society and localism

"People...in their neighbourhoods...feel both free and powerful enough to help themselves and their own Communities...."

[David Cameron, July 2010]

To engage or not to engage?

- Spectator or player?
- Localism *currently* = only game in town
- Eradicating poverty...and immediate need
- Maintaining integrity
- Community primacy 1st & foremost
- Guarded optimism...or optimistic caution?

What exactly is on offer? Part I

- Community approval/veto (local?) council tax rises via referenda
- Local councils etc right to challenge: express interest in running local authority services
- Community **right to bid** for a local asset when it comes available
- Local council listing of assets for protection and purchase

What exactly is on offer? Part II

- **General Power of Competence** free to do anything legal!
- **Community Infrastructure Levy**: money to places where development occurs
- Local council led **Neighbourhood Plans**
- Right to build without planning permission, given 50% support from voters

Making localism truly local

- Community right to support local council finances initiatives serving community / addressing needs
- Community right to plan 'Russian Doll' CLP + Neighbourhood Plan
- Community right to combine forces Local Council with Community Trust as 'executive' arm
- **Community right to cluster** market town & hinterland parishes as viable, sustainable unit for action

The bad and the ugly?

- "for he that hath, to him shall be given: and he that hath not, from him shall be taken even that which he hath" (Mark's Gospel)
- "492 cuts reported...worth £76,296,681" (Voluntary Sector cuts online)
- Community Organisers: 4,500 part-time volunteers
- 500 full time senior organisers paid for 1 year
- "The job of the organizer is to maneuver & bait the establishment" (Alinsky, 1989: 100)

The struggle for power

- Central Government
- Principal authorities
- Local councils
- Community groups
- Communities, & their local councils, need to take power to boost self-determination

The curate's egg – evidence from Glos.

- **75% of respondents**: "spending cuts are undermining the Big Society and only half feel able to compete for public service contracts"
- "Over 90% feel that the cuts are disproportionately affecting disadvantaged communities"
- Is Big Society achievable? 56% "unsure"
- Third sector suffering "reduction of a fifth in their income" 2011. Struggle to maximise revenue, reduce costs, save services, & sustain activity
