Localism 1

Conservative pre-election Green Paper:

"The creation of an Open Source planning system means that local people in each neighbourhood — a term we use to include villages, towns, estates, wards or other relevant local areas — will be able to **specify what kind of development and use of land** they want to see in their area...."

Localism 2

- David Cameron Big Society, not Big Government "We're giving local people more power over what
 happens in their neighbourhood so communities can
 come together...and take control over the look and feel
 of new developments in their area" The Sun (!) Oct 2010
- "When people know that they will get proper support to cope with the demands of new development; when they have a proper say over what new homes will look like; and when they can influence where those homes go, they have reasons to say "yes" to growth." Greg Clark – Minister for Decentralisation (Nov. 2010)

Neighbourhood Planning 1

- Neighbourhood Plans
- Neighbourhood Development Orders
- Community Right to Build Orders

I will focus on NP's, but the approach may also be applicable to others

Challenge – people may want to use the process to stop, rather than to improve the appearance and functioning of development.

Neighbourhood Planning 2

The NP process;

- 1 Agreeing the neighbourhood
- 2 Consult
- 3 Preparing the plan
- 4 Independent check
- 5 Community referendum
- 6 Neighbourhood Plan is made

Stages for an NP

1 Create an NP Group

2 Agree area & issues

- 3 What's in/What's out?
- 4 Make the Plan



Neighbourhood Planning 3

An NP is a Real Planning Document

Carries legal weight

Planning applications assessed against them

Appeals determined against them

Neighbourhood Planning 4

And so...

- In April 2012 the Localism Act came into force and communities became able to prepare Neighbourhood Plans
- The National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) has been in place since March 2012
- Following over 200 "Frontrunner" groups there are now around 550 NP's being considered or prepared.

A Vision

A recent LGC, PAS and Solace briefing note states;

"Think about the appetite in your communities for getting involved in planning. The opportunity here is for empowerment and revitalisation of neighbourhoods through plans that genuinely reflect local issues....This is an opportunity for an improved relationship with local communities that may feel more involved in the future of their area through the council's support".

NPPF Advice

on Neighbourhood Plans...

- 49. Neighbourhood plans give communities **direct power** to plan the areas in which they live.
- 50. This provides a powerful set of tools for local people to ensure that they **get the right types of development** for their community.
- 51. Neighbourhood plans will be able to **shape and direct development** in their area, **subject to** the presumption in favour of sustainable development.

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Technocracy - "Government by technicians, engineers & planners"

Planners/Planning Aid do we bring Our System to their processes and impose technocracy?

Yes, I know that NP's ultimately need to be sound, in conformity etc.

People need a bottom up approach not the evidence base requirement that strangled LDF's.

A learning process/opportunity for Planners

Turf wars – not just restricted to City 'Hoods - "a bitter struggle for territory, power, control, or rights"

In rural areas, which have seen multiple regeneration programmes over the years, is there competition for influence and funding between voluntary sector and community organisations and councils?

It takes two to Tango or two to make an argument?

Does a two tier system have an impact?

Are the Counties remote from NP's (even though transport, education and land ownership make them essential participants)?

NB amount of NPs in Cheshire West – 17

A Right Pickle(s) - "Eric Pickles is famous as the divisive leader"

Do party politics affect take up? – if the LPA does not promote and enable NP's do communities take options up e.g. contrast Derbyshire & Notts. with East Staffs and Cheshire West.

Conformity is the jailer of freedom and the enemy of growth – JFK

However, NP's need to conform with the NPPF and the Local Plan

If is difficult to make progress with NP's unless there is an up to date local plan – (ESBC & SBC).

The limits of capacity for NP's

- of communities, PC's and Forums
- of local planning authorities
- of consultees

Funding

"'Cause I don't care too much for money" (L&M)

- Frontrunner funding
- Neighbourhood Planning Fund
- Enhanced Community Infrastructure Levy
- A Platform to engage in S106 Agreements
- New homes bonus

Help is at hand

"Help me if you can, I'm feeling down..."

There is a lot of help out there

- CLG
- PAS
- Locality/Planning Aid

Working together

"Come together right now" Lennon & McCartney

- Mediation and conflict resolution
- Bring people and new partners together
- Involve businesses and developers

Seeing a bigger picture

The NP process will identify non-planning issues - community support could create opportunities for

- Lottery, (Big Local, HLF & Big Lottery)
- Other local authority programmes
- EC Funds (ERDP & LEADER)
- Charitable trusts
- Local business involvement and sponsorship

Conclusions

Neighbourhood Planning and Neighbourhood Plans are a good thing.

Be aware of the tensions and barriers, and work out ways to address these in order to exploit the undoubted opportunities that are present.
