

## The Fund

#### **Grants Schemes:**

- Development Grants up to £1000
- Small Grants up to £50,000
- Large Grants over £50,000

#### £10 million endowment:

- £5 million set aside for long-term investment, return used to fund administration and community development costs.
- £5 million set aside for Investment grants – either very large grants or investments that could provide a return or loans.
