- May 2012 problems with site of new cabinet causes delay

   September 2012
- Now over 45% take-up double Cheshire average
- But outer reaches of the village remain a challenge

# People Power can work!



A COMMUNITY is set to be connected to superfast broadband after a successful campaign against telecoms giant BT.

BT caused outrage among residents and businesses in Rainow in March when it pulled the plug on plans to upgrade its internet service. Telecoms bosses claimed

installing new broadband equipment breached highways regulations and was too expensive.

The village turned to Mac-clesfield MP David Rutley and the Express for help.

Now after two years of setbacks and delays, the service is finally set to be installed, taking speeds from 1kb to 60MB.
