- Making an upfront commitment
- Seeking broad (sustainability) outcomes
- Understanding geography (using evidence)
- Harnessing rural strengths
- Reducing the fixed costs of provision
- Accounting for a range of outcomes
- Taking a user focussed approach
  - Starting from first principles (i.e. needs)
  - Considering settlement interdependencies

- Designing in flexibility to delivery models
- Increasing use of existing assets
- Offering a portfolio of solutions
- Targeting spatial gaps in provision
- Focusing on hard to reach groups
- Using incentives or penalties in contracts
- Seeking collaborative approaches
- Testing new models before mainstreaming
- Monitoring outcomes at local levels

- Good Idea but was not promoted; could make a real difference
- Capacity building individuals and organisations
